
Dear Supporters,

Thank you for your support during this transition. We cannot wait for you to see the results!

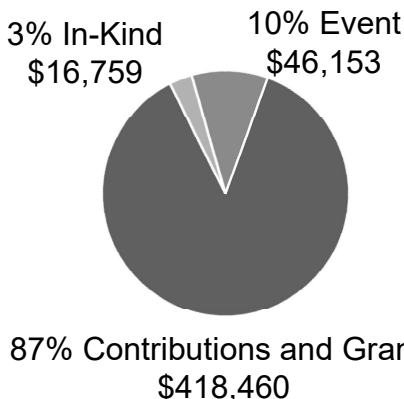

Revenue



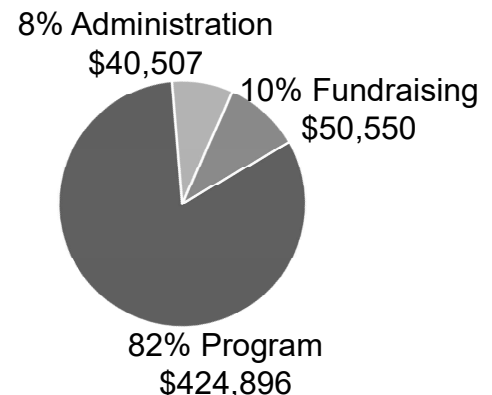
